Animatronics: A form of robotics used to create robots that produce preset moves and prerecorded sounds, sometimes in the form of lifelike puppets

Antique: Something made in an earlier period and collected and valued because it is beautiful, rare, old or of high quality

Collection: A group of objects that are similar. At the Dr Pepper Museum, they are all related to the soft drink industry.

Collection storage: The place that objects are stored that are not on exhibit.

Conservation: The protection or wise use of natural resources that ensures their continuing availability to future generations; the intelligent use of natural resources for long-term benefits.

Cotton Gloves: Protective barrier between person handling object and object to prevent transporting dirt and oil from handler's hands.

Humidity: A measure of the amount of water vapor in the air. Too much moisture or too little moisture can damage an object.

Light: Wavelengths of light visible to the human eye. Too much light can damage objects.

Mission: The guiding purpose behind the museum. The Museum uses its mission as a guideline for making decisions. It also gives identity to the organization.

Museum: A building where objects of historical, scientific, or artistic interest are kept. The American Association of Museums, the guiding national organization for museums, defines a museum as "an organized and permanent non-profit institution essentially educational and aesthetic in purpose, with a professional staff, which owns and utilizes tangible objects, cares for them, and exhibits them to the public on some regular schedule."

Objects: Items that are collected by a museum to fulfill its mission. The items are preserved and stored and can be used for exhibitions.

Permanent Exhibit: A display that is presented to the public with information about an object, theme, or time period.

Preservation: The act of keeping from destruction, decay or any ill, a process that saves organic substances from decay

Temperature: A measure of heat energy in an object, body or environment (can be measured using Fahrenheit, Celsius or Kelvin scales.) If the heat is too high or too cold then the object may be damaged.

Temporary Exhibit: A display that is presented to the public with information about an object, theme, or time period that is changed every few months

Tour guide: The person leading a group of visitors through the museum and telling them about the exhibits.

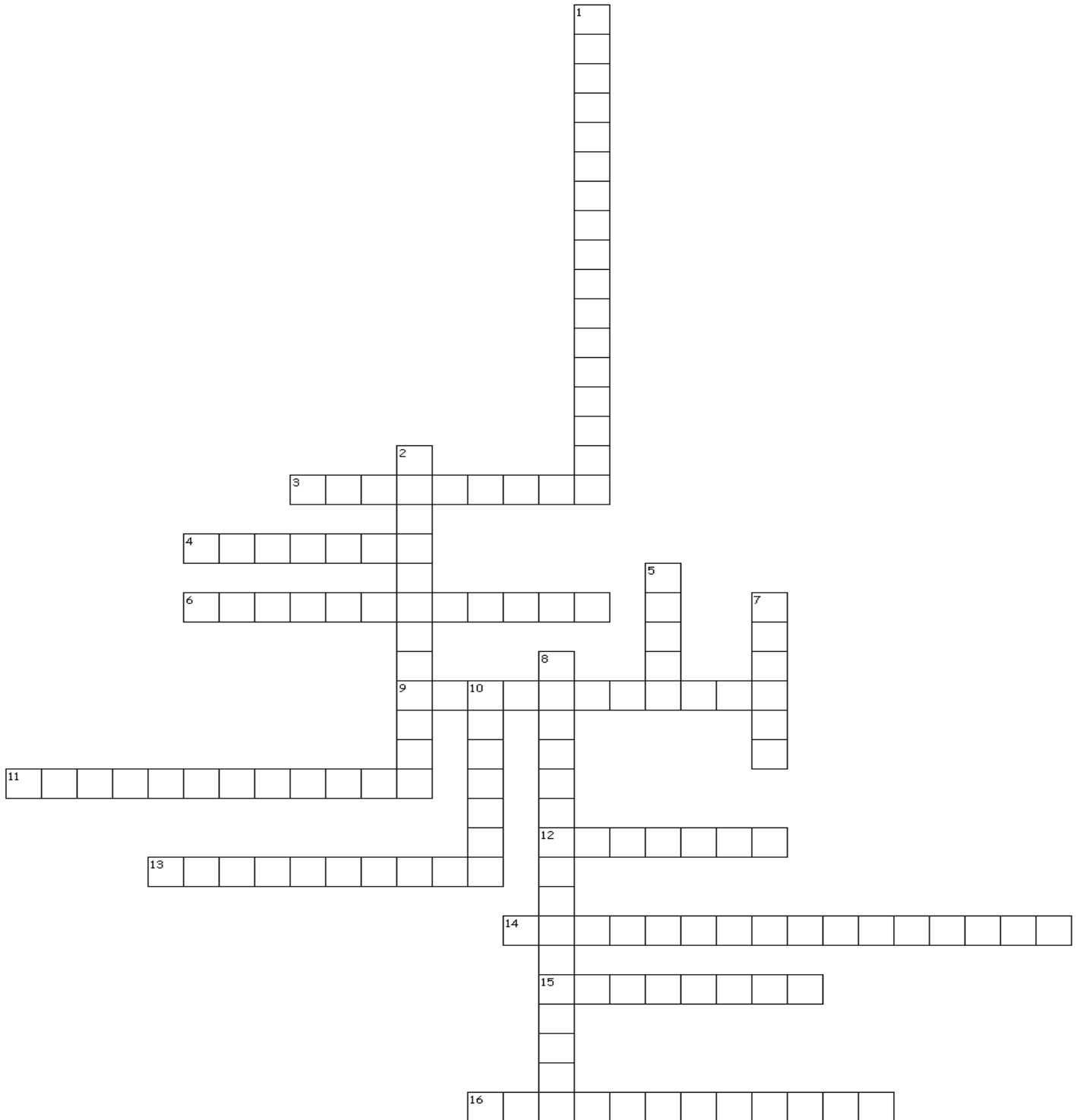
